It was the summer of 2007 that Doug McDougall and I paid a visit to Abatete to inform the community leaders about our plan to build a standard library to improve their standard of education. After receiving their resounding endorsement, my newly formed board members and I went to work, and step by step we built the Seat of Wisdom Library. The rest followed gradually years after.



The inauguration of this great institution took place on December 31st, 2015. No one expected such a high-level transforming edifice in such a disadvantaged community. Abatete has no economic stability or essential necessities like constant electricity or water supply. To move forward with the project, we provided solar powered water supply in the area. There was excitement in the community mixed with confusion, because we've refined their traditional system of education different from what was familiar to them. We fixed their confusion by providing adequate training programs to meet their needs.

Seat of Wisdom library is possible through the support of many key players. There are: Jim Chrzan, Erin Fowler, Doug McDougall, Mark J. It is not rocketing science to figure out that it is difficult to succeed when one does not know what it is that he doesn't know, because where is the information required to stir him to a different path?

It will all be foolery to expect something different from someone who has just known one thing all his life and nothing else without first taking the sacrifices and pains required to point him to a different approach. Not doing the needful to elevate people from point A to B will only leave them with the dark side of freedom—the freedom to fail. Misinformation is just as bad as lack of it—the former being used to keep people acting or thinking in a kind of way that is often flawed, and the later a 'blissful ignorance.'

To fully operate at a top-notch and qualitative level, the appropriate skilled labor needed for various setups and maintenances are sourced from far away which leads to delay in some cases and an obvious increase in running cost.

Oftentimes, we are victims of our own generosity. It is sad to see people only wonder and imagine the abundance we must have stacked up somewhere to be able to be as charitable with some of our programs. These set of people who feel entitled to your charity and do not think they owe you any form of gratitude will keep telling you to your face of how much you are keeping away from them.

Frankly, this is a big pothole that commitment to duty alone cannot fix. The pick and grab mentality and not thinking of how to promote and sustain an institution that is beneficial to the community. Most people in rural communities like ours are only worried about "now," never thinking of tomorrow, never seeing beyond their noses.

It is not out of place to mention how draining it is emotionally to serve in a community like ours. Witnessing firsthand the sufferings and systemic inequality makes you want to pour all of yourself out, which creates compassion fatigue. We pray and hope for better times, but in the meantime, our little consistent drops of water just might make a mighty ocean. It's been a decade now, and the goal hasn't changed. The goal to achieve high literacy rate and to promote access to e-learning in our community. Tough take, but even the smallest result is so fulfilling.



In a world ruled with "Naturalism" where most people want to do what is considered "natural" to them, we dare to go the other way. Don't we all naturally want to hurt someone who hurts us? Don't we all naturally want to eat till we almost get sick? Don't we all naturally want to pack up and run when it gets tough? But if we give in to this natural tendency, there's absolutely no way we can make our society better. So, chin up comrades!

Serving in a disadvantaged community is considered noble, but it comes with challenges that test resilience and commitment. These challenges strengthen compassion. When serious effort is expended, when disability is acknowledged and opportunities exposed through training and coaching, miracles can happen.





THE BENEFITS OF COMPUTER LITERACY


IT Certification

A+ SUPERMARKET

For many decades, Abatete locals lived without any standard convenience stores like those seen in cities like Onitsha, Nkpor, and Awka. Whenever the people of Abatete wanted to get some groceries like beverages and household goods, they must travel to the nearby cities for it. Everything, however, changed when A+ Supermarket came into Abatete through Seat of Wisdom institution. This convenience store (supermarket) stands as a beacon of hope, marking progress and demonstrating that development had made its way to Abatete. The indigenes are pleased and are rejoicing over the gift of A+ Supermarket in their community.

Before the arrival of A+ Supermarket to Abatete, many low-income households stayed months and even years without having access to common things like a bar of chocolate, a cup of ice-cream, wristwatch, perfumes, and so on because they couldn't afford the transportation fare to travel to the cities to get their desired needs. Such unfair gaps, and divides, have all been bridged, because of the presence of A+ Supermarket in Abatete, which has brought so much joy to many hearts.

A 52-year-old trader, Mama Ngozi, who gave us a review said:

“A+ SUPERMARKET IS NOTHING SHORT OF A BLESSING TO ME. BEFORE, I HAD TO GO ALL THE WAY TO ONITSHA JUST TO BUY THINGS FOR MY SMALL RETAIL SHOP. IF IT RAINED, THE ROAD BECAME TERRIBLE AND THERE WOULD BE SO MUCH GO-SLOW (TRAFFIC). BUT NOW, EVERYTHING I NEED IS AVAILABLE IN A+ SUPERMARKET, ABATETE. I DON’T HAVE TO STRESS MYSELF ANYMORE, AND I AM JOYFUL ABOUT THE NEW DEVELOPMENT.”

With A+ supermarket close by, daily essentials are no longer luxuries. Bread, rice, cooking oil, canned foods, even medicine and toiletries are all within walking distance. Life has become easier, and stress has drastically reduced in the community. Festive seasons in Abatete are brighter today than ever because A+ Supermarket has made it much easier for people to plan events during these seasons; they are always fully stocked with all the things needed to plan events; items like drinks, decoration materials, party packs, flour etc. Everything is now available locally, making celebrations more colorful and less stressful. One of our customers said “Before A+ supermarket came into Abatete, to organize a wedding was a wahala (stressful) for us; now, we can buy everything we need in our community. We are very excited.”



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A+ Supermarket did not just bring goods close to the people of Abatete, it equally brought many job opportunities, about 40 people are employed in our institution, working in various departments. We all know that with good jobs comes salaries, and with salaries comes dignity. This has helped to reduce the number of young people migrating to the cities seeking jobs.

First, small retail shop owners feared that A+ supermarket would drive them out of business. But instead, many discovered a new partnership. Some of them supply local goods like palm oil, snacks, eggs, and so on to A+ Supermarket. Others are still thriving from selling smaller quantities of items that the supermarket sells in bulk.

As a young girl, it was evident Veronica had a kind heart and a bubbly personality, and she was surrounded by a large circle of friends. Her love of children was undeniable- she was frequently asked to babysit family members and within her neighborhood.

An empath by nature, Veronica was part of the Snowball club in school, which is a peer counseling group of older students helping their younger peers navigate through personal or academic challenges. Veronica's high school principal said of her, "Veronica was a real sweet young girl who was very dedicated to her schoolwork and her activities. Her death will impact us throughout the year because she was such an integral part of her class."

Veronica loved to read and was often found sitting in a chair quietly flipping through a new book. She had an inquisitive mind and loved to learn; she was an excellent student and earned top grades. By high school she was consistently listed on the honor roll, and was also inducted into the National Honor Society, Spanish Honor Society, and was ranked in the top 10% of her high school class.

Months before her passing, Veronica was searching for the college that would be the best fit for her dream of becoming a nurse or possibly a teacher. Had she lived, we are certain Veronica would've found success in whichever community service field she chose. She was a dedicated servant at heart.



Finally, we had a light refreshment. All thanks to our proprietor Very Rev. Fr. Dr. Sylvester Amamchukwu Nnaso and his excellent team for including this in our curriculum as well implementing it to guarantee a holistic education for our learners.

Nnaso from Enugwu Nsukwu, Abatete began to pursue his passion for education and community building; and working together with some of his friends from McHenry, Illinois, USA; refined the traditional meaning of education in Abatete by establishing the first and only digital library in the history of Abatete named Seat of Wisdom.

Since the inception of the library in December of 2015, it has sponsored more than 1600 students in computer training, 260 schools in Spelling Bee annual competition, and 900 students in the Library Reading Club!
